65.7 For felony-level offenses, prior to the court's acceptance of a plea from the  
65.8 defendant, the court must notify the defendant that a guilty plea or conviction for a  
65.9 felony-level offense will result in a loss of the defendant's civil rights, including the right  
65.10 to vote, until the defendant's sentence has been discharged.

## 65.11 **ARTICLE 9**

### 65.12 **SEAT BELTS**

65.13 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2010, section 169.686, subdivision 1, is amended to read:

65.14 Subdivision 1. **Seat belt requirement.** (a) Except as provided in section 169.685, a  
65.15 properly adjusted and fastened seat belt, including both the shoulder and lap belt when the  
65.16 vehicle is so equipped, shall be worn by the driver and passengers of a passenger vehicle,  
65.17 commercial motor vehicle, type III vehicle, and type III Head Start vehicle.

65.18 (b) A person who is 15 years of age or older and who violates paragraph (a) is subject  
65.19 to a fine of \$25. The driver of the vehicle in which a violation occurs is subject to a \$25  
65.20 fine for each violation of paragraph (a) by the driver or by a passenger under the age of 15,  
65.21 but the court may not impose more than one surcharge under section 357.021, subdivision  
65.22 6, on the driver. A peace officer may not issue a citation for a violation of this section  
65.23 unless the officer lawfully stopped or detained the driver of the motor vehicle for a moving  
65.24 violation other than a violation involving motor vehicle equipment. The Department of  
65.25 Public Safety shall not record a violation of this subdivision on a person's driving record.

65.26 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective July 1, 2011, and applies to offenses  
65.27 committed on or after that date.
